### You Could be a Life Saver

At our last meeting Chief Roger Johnson shared with us a new series of smart phone

apps that his department is implementing that could put YOU in a position to save a life. The





alerts CPR-trained bystanders to someone nearby having a sudden cardiac arrest that may require CPR. The app is activated by the local public safety communications center simultaneous with the dispatch of local fire and EMS resources. The purpose of the app is to increase the survival rates of cardiac arrest victims by:

- Reducing collapse-to-CPR times by increasing citizen awareness of cardiac events beyond a traditional "witnessed" area.
- Reducing collapse-to-defibrillation times by increasing awareness of public access defibrillator (AED) locations through real-time mapping of nearby devices.






And one of **Bob** and **Barb's** happiest moment as parents and fans was riding on the 49er float through a tickertape parade after **Mike** and

with us.




## Postcards From...
