Newberry Crater Area. Nearly 25 years after Newberry Volcano became a national volcanic monument, one of its biggest proponents is glad how things turned out. "It has gone exactly how I and the rest of us had hoped it



would,"

potential
geothermal
development in
and near the
caldera of the

volcano south of Bend in the late 1980s drove the creation of the 54,822-acre Newberry National Volcanic Monument, which encompasses Paulina and East lakes, as well as

Lava River Cave, the Lava Cast Forest and Lava Butte. Stu Garrett, who wrote the 1991 book

"Newberry

National Volcanic Monument: An Oregon Documentary," helped lead the efforts to designate the national monument. Congress enacted the law establishing Newberry on Nov. 5, 1990.




Earl Schroeder read from the Guest Columnist article he had written for the Nugget News. Then Jim Horsley presented more about what
