printer go to waste when she bought a new one. So an idea was born. Why not collect, catalog, and resell the ink through the web in our community and turn the money over to the club for its charity programs.

So, as you find yourself buying a new printer or retiring an old one, please bring your unopened cartridges (and packages) to the meeting and we'll list them for sale.



My plan is to set up a web page thru our site and/or thru a Facebook Page to advertise available ink. The donor of the ink will receive a tax deduction receipt from the Club (they place value), but not the buyer will not as they received ink in exchange for their money. The buyer can be happy in knowing their purchase money will be directed to a Sisters Kiwanis charity/program.

In the future, as partnerships are established, I would hope we connect with other places of business to host our drop off point for both donations and purchases. Also, as there is a market for collecting expired/empty cartridges, I think it would be logical to add this to the mix as well.




Postcards From...
