With the recent passing of **Dave Clemens, Laurine Clemens** was receiving inquires about donations to charities in Dave's name. She felt that Cliff Clemens Park has been in need of some

shade trees around the kids play area and she felt that some maple trees would be a nice memorial to Dave. So **Laurine Clemens**, the Clemens family and many friends of **Dave Clemens** were able to donate \$1,475 to the Kiwanis Club of Sisters for use in providing shade trees around the play area. The City of Sisters agreed to provide the labor and materials necessary to plant and care for the trees. With these funds, Kiwanis was able to purchase 8 Autumn Blaze Maple trees and

2 Chokecherry trees from C&C Nursery in Sisters. These trees have just been installed in the park.

Next year a second phase of this project will involve the planting of 10 aspen trees that are being donated by **Bruce** and **Marleen Rognlien** who have been friends of the Clemens family for many years. The City of Sisters agreed also to plant and care for these trees.

Thanks to the Clemens family, the Rognliens, Sisters Kiwanis (led by **Dave Marlow**) and the City of Sisters for their donations and support of this project.


