Bob immediately joined Kiwanis having prior membership history while stationed in Arizona. I was the designated driver, so decided to join early in 2010. Sheryl Mclaughlin was my sponsor. Both of us joined for the opportunity to know and serve this unique community of Sisters and to meet likeminded people. We were not disappointed. Kiwanis became our family of friends.

Both of us became involved with the SMART (Start Making A Reader Today) program and I became the InterClub chairperson. When board member, Troy Gusick, became terminally ill, I completed his Kiwanis Board position. I have continued to be InterClub chairperson off and on since then.

In 2015, my Bobby, who endured Parkinson's Disease for almost all of our 17 years of marriage, developed liver and lung cancer and was gone in October of that year. He told me he could envision me as president of the club one day and I guess he was right! So here I am!




